# Study Day 6 October 2011

## Dürer, Holbein and the Art of the Northern Renaissance

A study day which complements the Royal Collection's exhibition *The Northern Renaissance: Dürer to Holbein* and the Scottish National Gallery's exhibition *Dürer's Fame* will be hosted jointly by both institutions on 6 October 2011. Talks by the exhibitions' curators, and distinguished European experts in Northern Renaissance Art, will focus on the work of Albrecht Dürer, his impact and fame, and his German, French and Netherlandish contemporaries.

The lectures will be followed by a podium discussion giving an opportunity to get involved and discuss the topics raised throughout the day with the experts. There will then be a chance to visit the *Dürer's Fame* exhibition at the Scottish National Gallery. To round off the day attendees are warmly invited to join the speakers at a private view of *The Northern Renaissance* exhibition and wine reception at The Queen's Gallery.
